TREES

Aesculus californica, "CALIF. BUCKEYE" - Drought tolerant, California native tree w/ hand-shaped leaves & foot-long plumes of creamy white, fragrant flowers in spring followed by large, shiny brown, inedible seeds. [21] (H*B*W*C*S*)

Bauhinia variegata, "PURPLE ORCHID TREE" - Spectacular, deciduous tree w/ light green, 2-lobed leaves & 3-in. purple, orchid-like flowers in late winter/early spring (a few may have white flowers). [10] (H*)

Brachychiton acerifolius, "AUSTRALIAN FLAME TREE" - Spectacular, nearly evergreen, large tree w/ thick, smooth trunk & dense head of large, shiny, lobed leaves; small red flowers born in red-stemmed, coral-like clusters in leafless portions of tree. [34] (H*W*)

Cercidium floridum, "BLUE PALO VERDE" - Calif. desert native, drought tolerant, small tree w/ blue green bark, blue-green, thorny branchlets, tiny, divided leaves & an abundance of bright yellow flowers in spring; fast growing. [5] (H*W*C*)

Myrtus communis 'Boetica', "BOETICA MYRTLE" - Choice form of this versatile, evergreen tree/shrub w/ dark green, shiny, aromatic leaves, arranged "foxtail" fashion on thick branches; fragrant white flowers & blue berries. [22] (W*F*)

Pinus sabiniana, "FOOTHILL PINE" - Adaptable, fast growing, Calif. native pine w/ distinctive open & lacy crown; 8-12 inch, gray-green needles & 6-10 in. cones w/ large, edible seeds. [7] (W*C*)

Platanus racemosa, "CALIFORNIA SYCAMORE" - Large, picturesque, Calif. native tree w/ pretty bark & large, maple-like leaves; for large, informal or natural gardens w/ some summer irrigation. [9] (B*C*)

Punica granatum 'Legrelle', "LEGRELLE POMEGRANATE" - Rare flower form of this popular, water efficient tree; glossy green leaves & fully double, creamy white flowers w/ coral-red stripes; no fruit. [32] (H*W*)

Quercus agrifolia, "COAST LIVE OAK" - Tough, drought tolerant, wide-spreading tree, w/ cupped, hollylike, dark green leaves; fast-growing

in youth, picturesque in age; Calif. native. [15] (B*W*C*)

Quercus engelmannii, "ENGELMANN OAK" - Tough, drought tolerant, wide-spreading tree, w/ hollylike leaves; fast-growing in youth, picturesque in age; Calif. native of Santa Rosa Plateau fame. [11] (B*W*C*)

Quercus lobata, "VALLEY OAK" - Majestic, Calif. native, low-water-use, deciduous, large tree w/ thick, spreading branches & handsome, deeply lobed leaves; fairly fast growth w/ some irrigation. [5] (B*W*C*)

Quercus wislizenii, "INTERIOR LIVE OAK" - Drought tolerant, Calif. native, evergreen tree growing slowly to 50 ft. tall & wide; dense, rounded head of shiny, dark green, leathery leaves & reddish bark. [8/7] (B*W*C*)

Vitex agnus-castus, "CHASTE TREE" - Tough, fast-growing small tree or large shrub w/ pretty, hand-shaped leaves & dense, conical spikes of small, blue purple, fragrant flowers over long summer season. [14] (B*W*S*)

SHRUBS

Acacia craspedocarpa, "LEATHERLEAF ACACIA" - Large, heat resistant shrub w/ handsome, rounded, gray-green leaves -- flowers are bright yellow bottle-brushes born in winter/spring; pods showy. [6] (W*)

Adenostoma sparsifolium, "RED SHANKS" - Drought tolerant, Calif. native, open shrub w/ handsome, red, peeling bark, feathery branches of short, needle-like leaves & dense, fluffy clusters of tiny white flowers. [19] (B*W*C*F*)

Arctostaphylos 'Lester Rountree', "MANZANITA" - Sturdy trunked large shrub or small tree to 15 ft. tall & 12 ft. wide w/ smooth, purplish bark, gray leaves & clusters of tiny, urn-shaped flowers, white flushed pink, in early spring; needs good drainage. [3] (H*B*W*C*)

Calliandra californica, "BAJA FAIRY DUSTER" - Water-efficient, heat-loving shrub from Baja Calif. w/ small, green, ferny leaves; flowers are fluffy brushes of bright dark red stamens born throughout warm weather; hummingbird favorite. [9] (H*B*W*)

***Callistemon viminalis* 'Red Alert', "RED ALERT BOTTLE BRUSH"** - Choice dwarf form of this favorite Aust. shrub; dense habit w/ narrow leaves flushing vivid red in spring & fall, & cerise, bottle-brush flowers in spring; hummingbird favorite; good Photinia substitute. [8] (H*W*)

***Calothamnus villosus*, "SILKY NET BUSH"** - Australian shrub w/ soft, gray, pine-needle-like foliage & bright red, one-sided, brush-like flower clusters along the stems from winter to late spring; commercial cut foliage plant. [5] (H*W*F*)

***Ceanothus* 'Joyce Coulter', "JOYCE COULTER CEANOTHUS"** - Drought tolerant, wide-spreading, mounding shrub 2-5 ft. high w/ 1-in, medium green leaves & spike-like clusters of tiny, medium-blue flowers in spring; withstands some summer water. [3] (B*W*C*)

***Coleonema pulchellum* 'Compactum', "PINK BREATH-OF-HEAVEN"** - A choice, lower, more spreading form of this South African shrub; dense shrub w/ dainty, bright green, aromatic leaves & an abundance of tiny, pink, starry flowers in winter/spring. [9] (W*B*F*)

***Coleonema pulchellum* 'Magenta', "PINK BREATH-OF-HEAVEN"** - Open shrub to 6 ft. tall & wide, w/ filmy appearance; needle-like, fresh green, aromatic leaves & an abundance of tiny, dark pink, starry flowers in winter/spring; butterfly favorite. [8] (W*B*F*)

***Correa* 'Dusky Bells', "AUSTRALIAN FUCHSIA"** - Water efficient, low shrub low shrub spreading to 3+ ft., w/ rich olive green, sandpapery leaves & bell-shaped, rosy-red flowers over long winter season; needs good drainage. [6] (H*W*)

***Cuphea* 'Starrfire', "STARRFIRE CUPHEA"** - Heat-loving shrub to 4 ft. tall w/ deep green, bronze-tinged leaves; flowers are rosy-red tubes tipped by contrasting purple & white, starry petal lobes; flowers spring to fall. [32] (H*F*)

***Dalea greggii*, "TRAILING INDIGO BUSH"** - Water efficient, spreading shrub w/ tiny, satiny gray green, ferny leaves & dainty, cloverlike clusters of purple, pea-shaped flowers over long spring/summer season; butterfly favorite. [10] (B*W*)

***Eremophila densifolia*, "PURPLE CARPET EMU BUSH"** - Water efficient shrub from Australian, about 1 ft. high & spreading 2-3 ft. w/ narrow, green leaves & tubular, purple flowers in spring/summer; hummingbird favorite. [4] (H*W*)

***Eremophila glabra* 'Mingenew Gold', "MINGENEW GOLD EMU BUSH"** - Low growing, water efficient shrub from Australian, about 1 ft. high & spreading 9-12 ft. w/ narrow, bright green leaves & tubular, yellow flowers w/ protruding stamens produced much of the year. [3] (H*W*)

***Euphorbia pulcherrima* 'Eckespoin', "POINSETTIA"** - In the garden, not a little holiday pot plant, but a spectacular, tall, deciduous shrub w/ masses of foot-wide, double-bracted, red flower heads over long winter season. [14] (H*B*)

***Forsythia hybrid* (Pamela), "FORSYTHIA"** - Temperate climate classic, early spring blooming shrub, this selection adapted to our Inland climate; the bare, wand-like branches lined w/ dainty, yellow flowers & later, toothed leaves; good cutflower. [39] (F*)

***Galvezia speciosa* 'Pink Panther', "PINK ISLAND SNAPDRAGON"** - Uncommon pink form of this Calif. native, spreading, evergreen shrub w/ light green, 1-in. leaves & 1-in, tubular, pink flowers heaviest in spring & intermittently during the year; hummingbird favorite. [9] (H*W*C*)

***Helianthemum* 'Hartwood Ruby', "SUNROSE"** - Evergreen shrublet 8-12 in. tall & 3 ft. wide, w/ narrow, dark gray green leaves & 1-in., red flowers in spring/summer; cut back after flowering for fall bloom; needs good drainage. [48] (W*)

***Lantana* 'Radiation', "LANTANA"** - Easy, heat-loving, mounding shrub w/ dark green, sandpapery leaves & rounded heads of starry flowers opening yellow & aging to rich orange-red; butterfly favorite. [9] (B*W*)

***Nashia inaguensis*, "MOUJEAN TEA"** - Evergreen, Carribean shrub w/ tiny, dark green, textured leaves that sparkle in the sun, & small clusters of tiny, cream-colored flowers; leaves scented like Earl Gray & used as an

herbal tea. [4] (B*)

***Pavonia missionis*, "PAVONIA"** - Fast-growing, open shrub w/ slender, wand-like branches & bristly, toothed leaves; plants dotted w/ satiny red, cup-shaped flowers over long spring-summer season. [18] (H*)

***Peritoma arborea* (*Isomeris arborea*), "BLADDERPOD"** - Calif. native, drought tolerant shrub w/ gray-green leaves, dainty yellow flowers through warm weather, followed by bright green, showy seed pods. [8] (H*W*C*)

***Salvia brandegeei*, "SANTA ROSA ISLAND SAGE"** - Calif. native, evergreen shrub w/ scalloped, aromatic leaves & long-stemmed, shish-kebob spikes of small, pale lavender blue flowers in early summer; good cut flower; needs good drainage. [41/6] (B*W*C*F*)

***Salvia canariensis*, "CANARY IS. SALVIA"** - Tall, bold-foliaged salvia w/ large, pointed, white-woolly leaves & thick, bronze-bracted spikes of tubular, 2-lipped, rosy-purple flowers in spring/summer; hummingbird favorite. [12] (H*B*W*F*)

***Salvia cedrosensis*, "CEDROS IS. SAGE"** - A water efficient, evergreen, Baja Calif. native shrub w/ small, silvery-gray, felty leaves on near white stems & loose spikes of small, two-lipped, blue flowers produced much of the year. [3] (H*W*)

***Salvia* 'Hot Lips', "AUTUMN SAGE"** - Easy, water-efficient shrub w/ tiny, aromatic leaves & abundant spikes of 1-in., tubular, white flowers tipped bright red - color may vary w/ temperature; hummingbird favorite. [64] (H*W*)

***Salvia x jamensis* 'Betty Moore 2', "AUTUMN SAGE"** - Water-efficient shrub w/ tiny, aromatic leaves, abundant spikes of purple-pink, 1-in. flowers & contrasting, darker flower stems; hummingbird favorite. [34/13] (H*W*)

***Salvia x jamensis* 'Bob & Bernie', "AUTUMN SAGE"** - Fast-growing, water-efficient shrub w/ tiny, aromatic leaves & abundant spikes of 2-lipped, 1-in. deep magenta flowers w/ dark calyxes over long spring to fall season; hummingbird favorite. [4] (H*W*)

***Salvia x jamensis* (dark pink #2), "AUTUMN SAGE"** - Water-efficient, much-branched shrub w/ tiny, aromatic leaves, abundant spikes of comparatively large, salmon pink flowers; hummingbird favorite. [14] (H*W*)

***Salvia x jamensis* (dark yellow), "AUTUMN SAGE"** - Water-efficient shrub w/ tiny, aromatic leaves & abundant spikes of 1-in., 2-lipped, dark yellow flowers from spring to fall; hummingbird favorite. [17] (H*W*)

***Salvia x jamensis* (fuchsia purple), "AUTUMN SAGE"** - Water-efficient, much-branched shrub w/ tiny, aromatic leaves, abundant spikes of comparatively large, fuchsia purple flowers & contrasting, darker calyxes; hummingbird favorite. [5] (H*W*)

***Salvia x jamensis* (magenta red), "AUTUMN SAGE"** - Water-efficient, much-branched shrub w/ tiny, aromatic leaves, abundant spikes of comparatively large, dark pink flowers & contrasting, darker calyxes; hummingbird favorite. [11] (H*W*)

***Salvia x jamensis* (light pink), "AUTUMN SAGE"** - Water-efficient shrub w/ tiny, aromatic leaves & abundant spikes of 1-in., 2-lipped, light pink flowers from spring to fall; hummingbird favorite. [6] (H*W*)

***Salvia x jamensis* 'Twilight', "AUTUMN SAGE"** - Water-efficient shrub w/ tiny, aromatic leaves along purple-black stems & abundant spikes of 1 in., delicate pink flowers w/ contrasting dark calyxes; blooms spring to fall; hummingbird favorite. [11] (H*W*)

***Salvia x jamensis* (Yellow w/ pink), "AUTUMN SAGE"** - Water-efficient shrub w/ tiny, aromatic leaves & abundant spikes of 1-in., yellow flowers blushed pink & w/ contrasting, darker calyxes & flower stems; hummingbird favorite. [3] (H*W*)

***Salvia madrensis* 'Red Neck Girl', "RED STEMMED FORSYTHIA SAGE"** - Tall, shrubby perennial w/ square, reddish stems, bright green, rough textured, heart-shaped leaves & 1-2-ft. long, spikes of 1-in., butter yellow, tubular flowers in fall/winter; good cutflower. [9/2] (H*F*)

Salvia munzii 'Baja Blue', "BAJA BLUE SAGE" - Calif. native derived, evergreen shrub w/ aromatic ashy, dark gray green leaves on reddish branches & shish-kabob spikes of tiny, lavender blue, tubular flowers w/ reddish calyxes. [5] (H*B*W*C*)

Salvia mellifera 'Terra Seca', "TERRA SECA SAGE" - Drought tolerant, Calif. native shrub, 1-2 ft. tall & 6+ ft. wide, w/ dark gray-green, aromatic leaves & shish-kabob spikes of tiny, white, tubular flowers in spring; loved by butterflies & hummingbirds. [5] (B*W*C*)

Santolina virens 'Lemon Fizz', "LEMON FIZZ LAVENDER COTTON" - Water efficient, Mediterranean native shrublet forming a low, spreading mound of fine-textured, aromatic, chartreuse foliage & yellow, button-like flower heads in summer; needs good drainage. [48] (B*W*)

Senna didymobotrya, "POPCORN CASSIA" - Evergreen shrub w/ handsome, divided leaves & candelabra-like spikes of black buds opening to large, yellow flowers in winter/spring; new growth & flower buds popcorn scented - especially fragrant form. [35] (B*S*)

Trichostema lanatum x purpusii, "HYBRID BLUE CURLS" - Calif. native derived, water efficient, 3- to 5-ft. shrub w/ narrow, dark green, aromatic leaves & purple, tubular flowers w/ conspicuous, protruding stamens; needs good drainage; hummingbird favorite. [4] (H*W*C*)

VINES

Clematis ligusticifolia, "VIRGIN'S BOWER" - Choice, Calif. native vine to 20 ft. tall w/ dainty, divided leaves & fluffy masses of fragrant, creamy-white flowers in spring; shade root zone, top in the sun. [7] (C*S*)

Hylocereus undatus, "DRAGON FRUIT" - Climbing cactus w/ 3-angled, self-adhering stems & mammoth (to 1 ft. long!) white flowers, that open in summer about 8 p.m. followed by delicious magenta-red, white-fleshed fruit. [14]

Hylocereus undatus, "DRAGON FRUIT" - Climbing cactus w/ 3-angled, self-adhering stems & mammoth (to 1 ft. long!) white flowers, that open in summer about 8 p.m. followed by delicious magenta-red, white-fleshed fruit. [29]

Vitis girdiana, "SOUTHERN CALIF. GRAPE" - Calif. native, woody vine, climbing by tendrils; picturesque in & out of leaf w/ shredding bark & slightly lobed leaves, velvety below; small, edible grapes attract wildlife. [3] (W*)

HERBACEOUS PLANTS (PERENNIALS)

Achillea millefolium 'Apricot Delight', "COMMON YARROW" - Tough, water-efficient perennial w/ dark green, ferny, aromatic foliage & tall, flat-topped clusters of long-lasting, dark pink flowers that age to salmon then light pink; butterfly favorite. [48] (B*W*C*F*)

Achillea 'Moondust', "YARROW" - Tough, water-efficient perennial w/ flat-topped clusters of long-lasting, creamy yellow flowers above a dark green, ferny, aromatic foliage mass; butterfly favorite. [48] (B*W*C*F*)

Achillea 'Pink Grapefruit', "COMMON YARROW" - Tough, water-efficient perennial w/ flat-topped clusters of long-lasting, pink flowers above a dark green, ferny, aromatic foliage mass; butterfly favorite. [48] (B*W*F*)

Amaryllis belladonna, "NAKED LADY" - Easy, drought tolerant bulb w/ strap-shaped leaves in winter & deliciously fragrant, powder-puff pink, lily-like flowers on 3-ft. stalks in summer. [30] (H*W*F*S*)

Anacyclus depressus 'Silberkissen', "MT. ATLAS DAISY" - Extra compact form of this pretty, mat-forming perennial w/ ferny, gray leaves

&, in summer, 2-in., white daisy flowers w/ yellow centers & deep rose red backs; needs good drainage. [18] (B*W*)

Armeria 'Nifty Thrifty', "SEA PINK" - Water efficient perennial forming a tight, spreading mat of narrow green leaves edged yellow, & long-stalked clusters of dark pink flowers spring to summer; butterfly favorite. [32] (B*W*C*F*)

Asclepias curassavica (red), "BLOODFLOWER" - Fast-growing, evergreen perennial w/ wand-like stems topped w/ striking clusters of red & orange, or yellow, waxy flowers over long summer/fall season; host for Monarch butterfly larvae. [36/26] (B*)

Asclepias curassavica 'Silky Gold', "BLOODFLOWER" - Fast-growing, evergreen perennial w/ wand-like stems topped w/ striking clusters of yellow-orange, waxy flowers over long summer/fall season; host for Monarch butterfly larvae. [24] (B*)

Aster chilensis 'Purple Haze', "COAST ASTER" - Calif. native, vigorous, rhizomatous perennial forming a low, wide-spreading foliage mass & 2-ft. branching sprays of pretty, bright violet daisies w/ yellow centers in late summer/fall. [4] (B*W*C*F*)

Aster 'Nana Hern', "MICHAELMAS DAISY" - Old fashioned favorite herbaceous perennial w/ narrow, dark green leaves & tall, branching clusters of blue-purple, daisy flowers in fall/winter; spreads vigorously. [11] (B*F*)

Aster 'Nana Hern', "MICHAELMAS DAISY" - Old fashioned favorite herbaceous perennial w/ narrow, dark green leaves & tall, branching clusters of blue-purple, daisy flowers in fall/winter; spreads vigorously. [36] (B*F*)

Aster 'Nana Hern', "MICHAELMAS DAISY" - Old fashioned favorite herbaceous perennial w/ narrow, dark green leaves & tall, branching clusters of blue-purple, daisy flowers in fall/winter; spreads vigorously. [74] (B*F*)

Buteloua curtipendula, "SIDE OATS GRAMMA" - Calif. native, clumping grass growing to 2-3 ft. in bloom, w/ blue-green leaves & graceful, long stalked, purplish flower heads w/ oat-like seeds arranged along one side of the stalk. [48] (W*C*F*)

Calandrinia grandiflora, "ROCK PURSLANE" - Chilean native perennial forming a 1-3 ft. mound of succulent, gray-green leaves & tall, slender stems bearing large, brilliant magenta, poppy-like flowers intermittently from spring to fall. [36] (F*)

Carex comans 'Olive Oil', "NEW ZEALAND HAIR SEDGE" - Exceptionally fine textured, grass-like perennial from New Zealand forming dense, clumps of thread-like, trailing, tawny silver leaves a foot or more long w/ "pigtail" tips. [28]

Carex flacca 'Blue Zinger', "BLUE SEDGE" - Versatile, grass-like perennial from Europe forming clumps of slender, ice blue blades a foot or more high, evergreen in mildest areas; can be clipped & will take some foot traffic; spreads but not invasive. [9]

Carex flacca 'Blue Zinger', "BLUE SEDGE" - Versatile, grass-like perennial from Europe forming clumps of slender, ice blue blades a foot or more high, evergreen in mildest areas; can be clipped & will take some foot traffic; spreads but not invasive. [9]

Centaurea gymnocarpa, "DUSTY MILLER" - Water efficient, evergreen perennial forming a dense mound of felty, white, finely divided foliage & purple, thistle-like flower heads produced on leafy stalks in summer; butterfly favorite. [32] (H*B*W*)

Convolvulus sabatius 'Compacta', "GROUND MORNING GLORY" - Dwarf form of this spreading, evergreen perennial w/ soft, gray-green leaves & 2-in., lavender-blue, funnel-shaped flowers over long summer/fall season; grows to 8 in. tall, 10 in. wide.. [48] (W*)

Dymondia margaretae, "SILVER CARPET" - Tight, spreading mat to 2-3 in. tall w/ gray-green leaves that are white felty below & small, yellow, gazania-like flowers in summer; good between pavers & can take some foot traffic. [47/16] (B*W*)

Echium wildpretii, "TOWER OF JEWELS" - Spectacular biennial; first year forming a rosette of bristly leaves; second year it becomes a 6-10 ft. tall cone w/ thousands of rose red flowers w/ protruding stamens, before setting seed & dying. [3] (H*B*W*)

Erigeron karvinskianus 'Spindrift', "SANTA BARBARA DAISY" - More compact & tame version of this easy-to-grow perennial native to Mexico, w/ 1 in., toothed leaves, & an abundance of 3/4 in., dainty white daisies tinged pink; blooms from early summer to fall. [11] (B*W*)

Erigeron x moerheimii, "PINK SANTA BARBARA DAISY" - Easy-to-grow perennial forming a mound 1-2 ft. high & 2-3 ft. wide w/ 1 in., toothed leaves, & an abundance of 3/4 in., dainty pink daisies; blooms from early summer to fall; does not reseed. [48] (B*W*)

Euphorbia 'Blackbird', "BLACKBIRD SPURGE" - Compact, mounding perennial to 2 ft tall w/ narrow, especially dark purple, velvety leaves arranged foxtail fashion along thick stems & long-lasting, clusters of bright yellow flower heads in spring. [48] (W*)

Euphorbia 'Shorty', "SHORTY SILVER SPURGE" - Compact, mounding perennial to 15 in. tall w/ narrow, blue-green, red-tinged leaves arranged foxtail fashion along thick stems & long-lasting, clusters of bright yellow flower heads in late winter. [32] (W*)

Festuca rubra 'Jughandle', "JUGHANDLE RED FESCUE" - California native, clumping form of red fescue making 6-12 in. mop-like hummocks of slender, chalky blue leaves; silvery to pinkish flowerheads produced in spring/summer. [29] (W*C*)

Gaura 'Pink Fountain', "PINK WANDFLOWER" - Choice form of this unusual perennial w/ broom-like habit & wandlike flower spikes that bear many dainty, 1-in., pink, butterfly-like flowers over long summer season. [4] (W*F*)

Heliconia latispatha, "LOBSTER CLAW" - Bold, tropical perennial w/ handsome, banana-like foliage & exotic, waxy, long-lasting flower head in scarlet & yellow; 40 year Riverside resident -- container or protected garden site. [5] (H*F*)

Heuchera 'Canyon Duet', "CORAL BELLS" - Dwarf perennial forming tight clumps of rounded, lobed, deep green leaves & abundant, airy spikes of tiny, glittering, dark rose & white flowers over long spring/summer season; Calif. native hybrid. [3] (H*C*F*)

Leonotis leonurus, "LION'S-TAIL" - Striking, water efficient, shrubby perennial from S. Africa w/ coarse foliage & tall, shish-kabob spikes of 2-in, velvety orange, tubular flowers in summer & fall; good cutflower & hummingbird favorite [5] (H*W*F*)

Leymus condensatus 'Canyon Prince', "BLUE WILD RYE" - Striking, slow-spreading, Calif. native grass forming loose clumps of stiff powdery-blue leaves & 3 ft., rigid powder-blue flower spikes well above the foliage. [3] (W*C*F*)

Modiolastrum lateritium, "PEACH BELLS" - Vigorous, spreading perennial only 6-8 in. tall but spreading many ft. by trailing stems, w/ maple-like leaves & 2-in., light salmon pink flowers w/ a dark central ring produced over a long summer season. [24] (B*W*)

Pennisetum 'Fairy Tails', "EVERGREEN FOUNTAIN GRASS" - Water efficient perennial forming handsome clumps of arching, blue-green leaves & upright, long-stemmed, dark wheat-colored flower plumes in summer. [13] (W*F*)

Penstemon 'Elfin Pink', "BORDER PENSTEMON" - Compact form of this asy, spreading perennial w/ narrow, green leaves & tall spikes of trumpet-shaped, deep pink flowers over long spring/summer season; hummingbird favorite. [64] (H*B*F*)

Phystegia virginiana, "OBEDIENCE PLANT" - Vigorous perennial, spreading by rhizomes w/ upright stems lined w/ toothed leaves & tall, dense spikes of delicate lavender pink, trumpet shaped flowers in summer;

long lasting in arrangements. [3] (H*F*)

Plectranthus argentatus, "SILVER SPUR FLOWER" - Fast-growing, soft shrub grown mostly for the striking, silver-haired, heart-shaped foliage; narrow spikes of tiny, pale lavender flowers. [5] (B*)

Plectranthus neochilus, "LOBSTER FLOWER" - Wide-spreading, evergreen perennial w/ succulent, fuzzy, strongly aromatic leaves & long-stalked, bracted clusters of tiny, deep blue & purple flowers on & off from spring to fall; for mildest Inland areas. [22] (W*)

Rhodanthemum hosmariense 'Casablanca', "MOROCCAN DAISY" - Water efficient, mounding perennial to 8 in. tall, spreading to 2 ft., w/ softly hairy, feathery, silver foliage & 2-in., white daisy flowers w/ yellow centers produced much of the year. [48] (B*W*)

Russelia equisetiformis 'Flamingo Park', "CORAL FOUNTAIN" - Spectacular penstemon relative w/ horsetail-like, arching, stems & tubular, coral-red flowers over a long season; hummingbird favorite; good in containers. [28] (H*F*)

Salvia argentea, "SILVER SAGE" - Short-lived, Mediterranean perennial forming rosettes of large, silvery, silky-haired leaves & 3-4-ft., branching spikes of 1 1/4 in., hooded, white flowers in summer; hummingbird favorite. [10] (H*)

Salvia 'Indigo Spires', "INDIGO SPIRES SAGE" - Fast-growing, soft shrub w/ rich green leaves & tall, slender, velvety spires of tiny, violet-blue flowers from early summer to frost. [18] (H*F*)

Scabiosa ochroleuca 'Moon Dance', "YELLOW PINCUSHION FLOWER" - Clumping perennial w/ dissected leaves & many long-stalked, creamy yellow flower heads over a long spring to fall season; good cut flower & a butterfly favorite. [64] (B*F*)

Sinningia tubiflora, "HARDY SINNINGIA" - Surprisingly hardy, tuberous perennial w/ velvety, crinkled leaves & long-stalked clusters of 3-in, tubular, fragrant, white waxy flowers in summer; needs good drainage. [20] (S*)

Sisyrinchium 'Stripey', "VARIEGATED BLUE-EYED GRASS" - Handsome selection of this Calif. native derived iris relative w/ dainty tufts of green leaves edged pale yellow & pretty, blue flowers w/ a yellow eye; blooms in spring/early summer. [48] (W*C*)

Sprekelia formosissima, "AZTEC LILY" - Easy & spectacular perennial from a high-necked bulb w/ strap-shaped leaves & 6-in., dark crimson, orchid-like flowers often several times a year; plant w/ bulb neck above soil level. [23] (H*W*F*)

Teucrium glandulosum, "DESERT GERMANDER" - Uncommon, Calif. desert canyon native, shrubby perennial w/ 3-lobed leaves & loose spikes of distinctive, near white, 5-lobed flowers streaked w/ purple & produced much of the year if irrigated. [6] (W*)

Verbena bonariensis 'Lollipop', "DWARF PURPLE TOP" - Dwarf form of this graceful, airy perennial w/ dense clusters of tiny, lilac flowers on long, branching stems above the foliage; flowers over long summer/fall season; butterfly favorite. [64] (B*W*)

Verbena lilacina 'De La Mina', "CEDROS IS. VERBENA" - Dark-flowered form of this water efficient, shrubby perennial w/ lacy foliage & head-like clusters of starry, lavender-pink, deliciously fragrant flowers much of the year. [5] (B*W*F*S*)

Zephyranthes candida, "WHITE RAIN LILY" - Easy, evergreen perennial from a bulb, w/ shiny deep green, grassy foliage & an abundance of single-stemmed, white, lily-like flowers in late summer/fall. [17] (W*)

Zephyranthes 'Prairie Sunset', "PINK RAIN LILY" - Easy perennial from a bulb, w/ deep green, grassy foliage & peachy-pink, single-stemmed, crocus-like flowers in summer; flowers born in successive flushes. [22] (W*)

Zephyranthes 'Prairie Sunset', "PINK RAIN LILY" - Easy perennial from a bulb, w/ deep green, grassy foliage & peachy-pink, single-stemmed, crocus-like flowers in summer; flowers born in successive flushes. [9] (W*)

Zephyranthes sulphurea, "YELLOW RAIN LILY" - Easy perennial from a bulb, w/ deep green, grassy foliage & single-stemmed, yellow, lily-like flowers in summer; flowers born in successive flushes. [7] (W*)

Aeonium arboreum, "SHRUBBY AEONIUM" - Succulent, branching shrub w/ thick stems terminated in rosettes of shiny green leaves & conical clusters of fluffy, yellow flowers on 8-in. stalks; good in landscape or container. [7/5] (W*)

Aeonium canariense hybrid, "CANARY IS. AEONIUM" - Dense, succulent shrub w/ stout stems w/ many rosettes of shiny, pale green leaves & large conical clusters of light yellow flowers in spring; good in landscape or container. [3] (W*)

Aeonium decorum, "GREEN PINWHEEL" - Much-branched, mounding, succulent shrub w/ many 2-in. rosettes of gray green, succulent leaves edged orange-red in sun & clusters of small, pinkish flowers in spring. [5] (W*)

Agave attenuata, "FOXTAIL AGAVE" - Spineless agave forming a 2-3-ft. rosette of large, soft, pale green leaves & a dramatic, arching spike of tubular, yellow green flowers; plantlets form on maturing flower spike; landscape or container. [30] (W*)

Agave gypsophila, "GYPSUM CENTURY PLANT" - Succulent perennial forming 2-3-ft. tall rosettes of powder blue, undulating, coarsely-toothed leaves; in age produces a 6-8-ft. spike of yellow orange flowers; plantlets form in flower spike. [4] (H*W*)

Agave isthmensis, "DWARF BUTTERFLY AGAVE" - Choice, diminutive agave, a succulent perennial forming compact rosettes to 1 ft. tall w/ short, broad, powder gray blue leaves that are narrowed at the base w/ marginal teeth & dark-spined tips. [6] (W*)

Agave lophantha 'Quadricolor', "CENTER BAND AGAVE" - Succulent perennial forming multiple rosettes of stiff, dark green leaves w/ a lighter central stripe & creamy marginal stripes, produces an unbranched spike of yellow-green flowers after several years. [8] (W*)

Agave macroacantha, "BLACK-SPINED AGAVE" - Succulent perennial forming multiple rosettes of stiff, blue-gray symmetrically arranged leaves w/ brown-toothed margins & black terminal spines; tall spike of green & purple flowers only in age. [3] (W*)

Agave macroacantha, "BLACK-SPINED AGAVE" - Succulent perennial forming multiple rosettes of stiff, blue-gray symmetrically arranged leaves w/ brown-toothed margins & black terminal spines; tall spike of green & purple flowers only in age. [6] (W*)

Aloe barberae (*A. bainesii*), "TREE ALOE" - Statuesque tree w/ many pale branches topped by contrasting rosettes of recurved, dark green succulent leaves & dense spikes of tubular, rose pink flowers in winter; hummingbird favorite. [16] (H*W*)

Aloe 'Blue Elf', "BLUE ELF ALOE" - Compact, succulent perennial forming many stemless rosettes of narrow, silvery-blue, toothed leaves & spikes of tubular, coral red flowers in winter & spring; hummingbird favorite. [11/3] (H*W*)

Aloe brevifolia, "SHORT-LEAVED ALOE" - Succulent perennial forming dense, spreading clumps; stemless rosettes of short, fleshy, gray green, toothed leaves & spikes of tubular, red flowers in late summer; hummingbird favorite. [20] (H*W*)

Aloe 'California', "CALIFORNIA ALOE" - Succulent shrub w/ numerous erect stems bearing rosettes of upright, gray green, tapered leaves & branching spikes of tubular, orange-red flowers in winter/spring; hummingbird favorite. [7] (H*W*)

Aloe chabaudii 'Orange Burst', "DWALA ALOE" - Drought tolerant, succulent perennial forming mostly stemless, 2-ft. rosettes of toothed, bluish-green leaves & much-branched clusters of tubular, orange flowers

in winter; hummingbird favorite. [7] (H*W*)

Aloe ciliaris, "CLIMBING ALOE" - Vining, succulent shrub, the slender branches lined w/ thin-textured, dark green, finely toothed leaves & short spikes of tubular, red flowers w/ yellow tips; best w/ support; hummingbird favorite. [25] (H*W*)

Aloe 'Crosby's Prolific', "CROSBY'S PROLIFIC ALOE" - Succulent perennial forming dense clumps of stemless rosettes of short, fleshy, dark gray green, many-toothed leaves & spikes of tubular, red orange flowers in spring; hummingbird favorite. [4] (H*W*)

Aloe elgonica, "ALOE" - Succulent shrub w/ several erect stems bearing rosettes of distinctively toothed, bronzy red, fleshy leaves & branching spikes of tubular, orange-red flowers in winter/spring; hummingbird favorite. [13] (H*W*)

Aloe elgonica, "ALOE" - Succulent shrub w/ several erect stems bearing rosettes of distinctively toothed, bronzy red, fleshy leaves & branching spikes of tubular, orange-red flowers in winter/spring; hummingbird favorite. [12] (H*W*)

Aloe x nobilis, "GOLDEN TOOTHED ALOE" - Succulent perennial forming many rosettes of of triangular, dark green, white- to yellow-toothed leaves & torch-like spikes of tubular, bright orange flowers in summer; hummingbird favorite. [5] (H*W*)

Aloe pictifolia, "SPECKLED ALOE" - Succulent perennial forming stemless rosettes of narrow, toothed, fleshy leaves that are reddish green w/ white spots & branching spikes of tubular, orange red flowers in winter; hummingbird favorite. [4] (H*W*)

Aloe 'Rooikappie', "LITTLE RED RIDING HOOD" - Succulent perennial forming stemless, foot-wide rosettes of toothed, spotted leaves & branching, dome-shaped clusters of tubular, red orange flowers w/ yellow tips much of year; hummingbird favorite. [23] (H*W*)

Aloe saponaria, "SOAP ALOE" - Succulent perennial forming many stemless rosettes of fleshy, broadly lance-shaped, spotted leaves & tubular, orange flowers in 3 ft., branching, candelabra-like flower clusters; hummingbird favorite. [4] (H*W*)

Aloe sinkatana, "SUDANESE YELLOW ALOE" - Succulent perennial forming many stemless rosettes of fleshy, gray-green, toothed leaves w/ white spots & tubular, yellow flowers in ball-like clusters on branching stems; hummingbird favorite. [10] (H*W*)

Aloe striatula, "HARDY ALOE" - Semi-climbing, succulent shrub w/ slender stems lined w/ narrow, dark green, finely toothed leaves & spikes of pendulous, tubular yellow flowers in late spring; hummingbird favorite; hardy to 15 degrees. [12] (H*W*)

Aloe 'White Fox', "WHITE FOX MINIATURE ALOE" - Miniature aloe, a succulent perennial forming rosettes of fleshy, pale green, white-speckled leaves & spikes of tubular, orange-red flowers in summer; hummingbird favorite. [4] (H*W*)

Aloe zebrina, "SPOTTED ALOE" - Succulent perennial forming few stemless rosettes of tapered, dark green, spotted leaves edged w/ reddish teeth & tall, branching spikes of tubular, coral red flowers in spring; hummingbird favorite. [12] (H*W*)

Bulbine 'Hallmark', "ORANGE BULBINE" - Water-efficient groundcover perennial from S. Africa w/ tight mat of narrow, succulent leaves & spikes of orange & yellow, starburst flowers over long season. [20/8] (H*B*W*)

Cotyledon 'Happy Young Lady', "FINGER ALOE" - Stout-trunked, succulent shrub w/ finger-like, silvery-green, fleshy leaves tipped in purple & clusters of showy, salmon orange, bell-shaped flowers on stiff stalks; hummingbird favorite. [70] (H*W*)

Cotyledon orbiculata 'Silver Storm', "PIG'S EARS" - Stout-stemmed, succulent shrub w/ rounded, silvery-green, fleshy leaves w/ red margins & clusters of showy, waxy orange, bell-shaped flowers on stiff stalks; hummingbird favorite. [3] (W*)

Crassula arborescens, "SILVER JADE PLANT" - Compact, succulent shrub w/ thick branches w/ fleshy, rounded leaves that are gray green, edged & spotted red; starry, white, summer flowers rare; landscape, container or bonsai-trained. [12] (W*)

Crassula falcata, "PROPELLOR PLANT" - Succulent shrub to 2 ft. tall w/ fleshy, gray green, sickle-shaped leaves arranged in overlapping pairs along the stems & dense, dome-shaped clusters of scarlet flowers in summer. [13] (W*)

Crassula lycopodioides, "GIANT WATCH CHAIN CRASSULA" - Mounding, succulent shrub to 1 ft. tall w/ fleshy, awl-shaped, bright green leaves close-set in a criss-crossed arrangement along the stems; tiny, greenish flowers are inconspicuous. [16] (W*)

Crassula platyphylla 'Burgundy', "BURGUNDY CRASSULA" - Succulent shrub to 1.5 ft. high w/ long, tapered, green leaves, the margins purplish; foliage takes on a burgundy blush in cold weather; tiny, white flowers in spring more interesting than showy. [16] (W*)

Delosperma dyeri 'Red Mountain', "RED MOUNTAIN ICEPLANT" - Succulent, evergreen groundcover to 2 in. tall, 2 ft. wide, w/ succulent, shiny green leaves & spectacular, red flowers w/ white centers in spring/summer; best w/ afternoon shade. [7] (B*W*S*)

Dudleya brittonii, "CHALK LETTUCE" - Baja Calif. native succulent producing striking rosettes of broad, lance-shaped, white powdery leaves on a short trunk & tall spikes of small, short-tubular, yellow flowers; hummingbird favorite. [3] (H*W*)

Dudleya pulverulenta, "CHALK DUDLEYA" - So. Calif. native succulent producing a striking rosette of chalky white, broad, lance-shaped leaves on a short trunk & tall spikes of small, short-tubular, red, chalky flowers; hummingbird favorite. [3] (H*W*)

Echeveria glauca 'Crystal', "BLUE HENS & CHICKS" - Succulent perennial forming many, symmetrical rosettes of silvery blue, spoon-shaped leaves blushed red & branching spikes of coral & orange, tubular flowers in summer; hummingbird favorite. [48] (H*W*)

Echeveria runyonii 'Topsy Turvy', "HENS & CHICKS" - Succulent perennial forming many, symmetrical rosettes of curiously curved, silvery blue leaves & branching spikes of yellow & orange, tubular flowers in summer; hummingbird favorite. [64] (H*W*)

Echinocereus cinerascens, "HEDGEHOG CACTUS" - Many branched, clumping cactus w/ thick, dark green, mostly 5-8-ribbed, cylindrical stems lined w/ light colored spines, large, many-petaled, purple pink flowers in spring/summer & edible, spiny fruits. [3] (H*W*)

Echinocereus tayopensis, "BISNAGUITA" - Clump-forming cactus, many branched from the base w/ thick, olive green, 14-16-ribbed, cylindrical stems lined w/ white to brown spines & large, many-petaled, yellow flowers in spring/summer. [9] (H*W*)

Echinopsis candicans, "TORCH CACTUS" - Clump-forming cactus, branched from the base w/ 5-in. thick, light green, 9-11-ribbed, trailing stems lined w/ brownish spines & large, white, fragrant flowers in spring/summer, opening at night. [4] (H*W*)

Echinopsis huascha (yellow), "YELLOW TORCH CACTUS" - Clump-forming, shrubby cactus, branched from the base w/ thick, bright green, 14-17-ribbed, columnar stems lined w/ long, tan spines & many-petaled, yellow, bell-shaped flowers in spring/summer. [3] (H*W*)

Echinopsis huascha (salmon), "SALMON TORCH CACTUS" -

Clump-forming, shrubby cactus, branched from the base w/ thick, bright green, 14-17-ribbed, columnar stems lined w/ long, tan spines & many-petaled, salmon, bell-shaped flowers in spring/summer. [5] (H*W*)

Echinopsis spachiana, "WHITE TORCH CACTUS" - Clump-forming, shrubby cactus, branched from the base w/ thick, bright green, 10-15-ribbed, columnar stems lined w/ gold to tan spines & many-petaled, white, bell-shaped flowers rarely produced for us. [4] (W*)

Eriosyce chilensis, "CHILENITO" - Globular to short-cylindrical cactus from Chile, the body light green w/ about 20 ribs & stiff spine clusters; many-petaled, satiny pink flowers in spring/summer. [10] (W*)

Euphorbia flanaganii, "MEDUSA'S HEAD" - Strange, succulent perennial bearing numerous green, bumpy, snake-like branches arising from a stout crown, the crown topped in summer w/ many small, chartreuse flower heads; frost tender. [14] (W*)

Euphorbia horrida hybrid, "AFRICAN MILK BARREL" - Upright, succulent shrub w/ 2-in- thick, gray green, ridged stems; ridges lined w/ spines formed from old flower stems; tiny, red-brown flowers at the branch tips are conspicuous; frost tender. [6] (W*)

Ferocactus cylindraceus, "CALIF. BARREL CACTUS" - Calif. native, globular to cylindrical cactus to 4-6+ ft. tall in age w/ an olive green body having 18-31 ribs, the ribs edged w/ stiff, red to gray spines; satiny-petaled, yellow flowers in summer. [15] (W*C*)

Furcraea foetida, "MAURITIUS HEMP" - Agave-like plant forming a 5-8-ft. rosette of deep green, sword-shaped, spine-tipped leaves &, in age, a 20+ ft., tree-like stalk of tubular, yellow green flowers; plantlets form on maturing flower spike. [42] (W*)

Furcraea macdougallii, "TREE FURCRAEA" - Agave-like plant forming a 7-ft. rosette of sword-shaped, spine-tipped leaves atop a stout trunk &, in age, a 20+ ft., tree-like stalk of greenish whiteflowers; plantlets form on maturing flower spike. [13/8] (W*)

Graptopetalum paraguayense, "GHOST PLANT" - Succulent perennial w/ trailing stems forming many rosettes of fleshy, spoon-shaped, gray-green leaves tinged pink; branching clusters of star-shaped, white flowers w/ red spots; good groundcover. [10] (W*)

Kalanchoe luciae, "PADDLE PLANT" - Spreading, succulent perennial w/ large, rounded, clam shell shaped leaves that are powdery white & blushed red in winter, & tall, branching spikes of tubular, light yellow flowers in spring. [12] (H*W*)

Manfreda maculosa, "SPICE LILY" - Succulent perennial w/ fleshy, strap-shaped leaves w/ bold, maroon blotches & tall spikes of tubular, long-stamened, scented flowers in summer, these open white & age to red; hummingbird favorite. [65] (H*)

Opuntia azurea, "COYOTILLO" - Succulent shrub to 5 ft. tall w/ rounded, flattened, jointed stems, these "pads" blue green & topped by multicolored spines; spectacular, bowl-shaped, flowers are satiny yellow w/ fiery red centers. [5] (H*W*)

Opuntia quimilo, "QUIMILO" - Tree form prickly-pear-type cactus w/ short, rounded pads & enormous thorns (to 6 in. long); many-petaled, bright red flowers produced abundantly over long spring season. [8] (W*)

Oscularia deltoides, "PINK ICEPLANT" - Succulent groundcover to 1 ft. tall, 3 ft. wide, w/ succulent, pale blue-green, toothed leaves on wiry, dark pink stems & fragrant, satiny-petaled, purple-pink flowers in spring/summer; needs good drainage. [22] (B*W*S*)

Portulacaria afra, "ELEPHANT FOOD" - Versatile, succulent, S. African shrub to 12 ft. w/ thick, reddish stems & small, dark green, rounded leaves; tiny, pink flowers rarely produced; can be used as hedge, screen, container plant or bonsai. [4] (W*)

Portulacaria afra, "ELEPHANT FOOD" - Versatile, succulent, S. African shrub to 12 ft. w/ thick, reddish stems & small, dark green, rounded leaves; tiny, pink flowers rarely produced; can be used as hedge, screen, container plant or bonsai. [31] (W*)

***Portulacaria afra* forma *macrophylla*, "LARGE LEAF ELEPHANT FOOD"** - Large leaf form of this versatile, S. African shrub to 12 ft. tall w/ thick, reddish stems & 1-in., green, rounded leaves; tiny, pink flowers rarely produced; can be used as hedge, screen, or container plant. [20] (W*)

***Rebutia krainziana*, "KRAINZ' CROWN CACTUS"** - Clumping, globular cactus, the bodies dark green w/ many spirally arranged tubercles tipped by tiny, white, spine clusters; many-petaled, funnel-shaped, red flowers practically hide the plant in summer. [8] (W*)

***Rhodiola pachyclados*, "AFGHAN SEDUM"** - Mat forming perennial w/ tight rosettes of succulent, gray green leaves & short, branching spikes of starry, white flowers in summer; good drainage. [48] (W*)

***Sedum adolphii*, "GOLDEN STONECROP"** - Succulent perennial w/ trailing stems forming many rosettes of fleshy, spoon-shaped, yellow & orange colored leaves; fluffy clusters of fragrant, star-shaped, white flowers; good groundcover or container plant. [48] (W*)

***Sedum dasyphyllum* 'Major', "BLUE TEAR SEDUM"** - Dimuitive, Mediterranean native, succulent perennial 2-5 in. tall & a foot or more wide, w/ tiny, gray-green, fleshy leaves tightly packed along the stems & starry, white flowers w/ pink streaks in summer. [48] (W*)

***Sedum dendroideum*, "BUSH SEDUM"** - Succulent, Mexican shrub to 3 ft. high & wide w/ 2-in., bright yellow green, rounded leaves & branching clusters of starry, vivid yellow flowers produced above the foliage in winter/spring. [20] (W*)

***Sedum hispanicum* 'Purpureum', "STONECROP"** - Dimuitive, succulent perennial 2-5 in. tall by 1 ft. wide, w/ tiny, gray-green, fleshy leaves tightly packed along the stems, the leaves blushing purple in winter, & starry, white flowers in summer. [48] (W*)

***Sedum makinoi* 'Limelight', "LIMELIGHT JAPANESE STONECROP"** - Dimuitive, mat-forming, succulent perennial 2-4 in. tall by 2 ft. wide, w/ many tiny rosettes of lime green, fleshy leaves & starry, white flowers in summer. [48] (W*)

***Sedum nussbaumerianum*, "COPPERTONE STONECROP"** - Succulent perennial w/ trailing stems forming many rosettes of fleshy, spoon-shaped, yellow & orange colored leaves; fluffy clusters of fragrant, star-shaped, white flowers; good groundcover or container plant. [48] (W*)

***Sedum palmeri*, "PALMER'S SEDUM"** - Mounding, succulent shrub w/ many 2-in. rosettes of waxy blue, succulent leaves & branched clusters of small, starry, bright yellow flowers in late winter; landscape or container in part sun/light shade. [4] (W*)

***Sedum rubrotinctum*, "PORK & BEANS"** - Succulent perennial 6-8 in. tall by 1+ ft. wide, w/ jelly bean-shaped, red-tinted, fleshy leaves tightly packed along the stems & starry, yellow flowers in summer; detached leaves form new plants. [48] (W*)

***Sedum rupestre* 'Angelina', "ANGELINA STONECROP"** - Succulent perennial forming mats 3-6 in. tall by 2-3 ft. wide, w/ slender, chartreuse, fleshy leaves tightly packed foxtail fashion along the stems & starry, yellow flowers in summer. [48] (W*)

***Sedum rupestre* 'Silver', "SILVER STONECROP"** - Succulent perennial forming mats 3-6 in. tall by 2-3 ft. wide, w/ slender, silvery green, fleshy leaves tightly packed foxtail fashion along the stems & starry, yellow flowers in summer. [48] (W*)

***Senecio jacobsenii*, "TRAILING JADE"** - African native, succulent, groundcover perennial w/ fleshy, rounded leaves overlapping like shingles along the trailing stems; orange, tufted flowerheads rarely produced. [10] (B*W*)

***Tephrocactus articulatus*, "PAPER-SPINED CHOLLA"** - Unusual cholla-type cactus w/ succulent stems articulated into rounded sections that easily break off & take root, long, flexible, flattened spines, & pinkish, multi-petaled flowers in spring/summer. [14] (W*)

SHADE PLANTS

***Abutilon* 'Moonchimes', "FLOWERING MAPLE"** - Dwarf form of this fast-growing, evergreen shrub to 3-5 ft. tall w/ maple-like leaves & large, nodding, light yellow, bowl-shaped flowers over long spring summer season; hummingbird favorite. [12] (H*)

***Abutilon pictum* 'Aureo-maculatum', "FLOWERING MAPLE"** - Fast-growing, evergreen shrub w/ maple-like leaves spotted & blotched w/ glowing yellow-white & nodding, bell-shaped, yellow-orange flowers w/ crimson veins over long season. [61] (H*)

***Adiantum venustum*, "HIMALAYAN MAIDENHAIR"** - Rarely offered, true fern w/ much divided, triangular leaves made up of many, bright green to blue green, fan-shaped leaflets on jet-black, wiry stems; evergreen in all but coldest climates. [20]

***Aspidistra elatior* 'Starry Night', "CAST-IRON PLANT"** - Rare form of this Victorian favorite -- tough, slow-growing plant indoors or outdoors, w/ bold, deep green leaves heavily spotted yellow; can take even deep shade. [13]

***Bergenia crassifolia*, "WINTER-BLOOMING BERGENIA"** - Tough perennial for shade, w/ bold, bronze-tinted, rounded leaves & branching clusters of pretty, funnel-shaped, pink flowers in winter/early spring; good cut flower. [4] (F*)

***Clivia miniata*, "CLIVIA"** - Perennial for shade w/ handsome, deep green, broad, strap-shaped leaves & large, long-stalked clusters of glowing orange, funnel-shaped flowers & showy, red berries. [11] (H*F*)

***Costus spiralis*, "STEPLADDER PLANT"** - Tropical plant w/ handsome foliage spirally arranged on cane-like stems & exotic, yellow, tubular flowers born in orange-brown, conelike inflorescence; mildest inland areas or protected patios. [7] (H*)

***Cryptbergia* 'Red Burst', "CRYPTBERGIA"** - Unusual pineapple relative forming rosettes of 8-12 in., succulent, deep bronze-red leaves; small, white flowers are inconspicuous; light shade & moderate watering; good in containers. [7]

***Dianella revoluta* 'Little Rev' PP17719, "BLACK ANTHUR FLAX LILY"** - Evergreen lily relative from Australia forming tight, upright clumps of narrow, blue green leaves, yellow green on the less visible upper surface; grown for the bold plant form as it rarely blooms. [5]

***Haemanthus albiflos*, "SHAVINGBRUSH FLOWER"** - Evergreen, bulbous, perennial w/ broad, flat, tongue-shaped leaves producing a thick stalk topped by a white & gold, "shaving-brush" flower cluster in summer; needs good drainage; good in containers. [18]

***Haemanthus coccineus*, "CAPE TULIP"** - Choice container plant for patio; attractive broad, tongue-shaped leaves in winter & a thick stalk topped by coral red bracts & coral red & gold "shaving-brush" flower cluster in summer. [4] (H*F*)

***Mackaya bella*, "FOREST BELL BUSH"** - Year around handsome, evergreen shrub w/ shiny, deep green leaves & long, loose clusters of pale lavender, trumpet-shaped flowers w/ dark purple veins; tolerates much or little water. [8] (H*)

***Ophiopogon japonicus* 'Silver Mist', "MONDO GRASS"** - Reliable & versatile perennial for shade; handsome clumps of slender, grass-like leaves that are heavily variegated white; tiny, lilac flowers on short stems are followed by blue fruits. [8] (F*)

***Parahebe linifolia*, "VERONICA"** - Loosely trailing, shrubby perennial to 1 ft. tall for a cool spot in light shade; dark green, shiny foliage sets off the spikes of white, saucer-shaped flowers w/ red centers; summer bloom. [48] (B*)

***Plectranthus forsteri* 'Marginatus', "WHITE-EDGED SPURFLOWER"** - Viny perennial for light shade, related to coleus; velvety, medium green, ovate leaves handsomely margined creamy white; spikes of tiny, pale mauve flowers produced intermittently. [18]

Symphoricarpos rotundifolius v. *parishii*, "**ROUND-LEAVED SNOWBERRY**" - Calif. streamside native, deciduous shrub w/ dark, wiry stems bearing small, oval leaves clusters of small, white to pale pink flowers, & half-inch, pearly white berries; hummingbird favorite. [19/15] (H*C*)

Tradescantia 'Blushing Bride', "**BLUSHING BRIDE SPIDERWORT**" - Fast-growing, wide spreading, groundcover perennial w/ leaves green in warm weather & strikingly variegated white & pink in cool weather, growing two-ranked along stems; starry, pink flowers in summer. [25]

Veltheimia bracteata, "**VELTHEIMIA**" - Choice bulb for light shade w/ handsome, wavy-edged, shiny foliage & long-stemmed, spike-like clusters of tubular, green-tipped pink flowers in late winter/early spring; can be kept dry in summer. [27] (H*F*)

HOUSE & PATIO PLANTS

Acalypha hispida, "**CHENILLE PLANT**" - Fast-growing, easy shrub for summer patio or houseplant; large, heart-shaped leaves & drooping, 5-in., crimson, chenille-like flower spikes through warm weather; pinch to promote bushiness. [10]

Acalypha wilkesiana 'Ceylon', "**COPPER LEAF**" - Fast-growing, easy shrub for summer patio or houseplant all year; heart-shaped leaves are slightly puckered, dark green w/ a cream-fringed edge; fuzzy flowers interesting but not showy. [3]

Amorphophallus rivieri, "**UMBRELLA ARUM**" - From a tuber in spring is produced a single, long-stalked, umbrella-shaped leaf, the stalk dark spotted & the leaf divided; mature plants produce a large (to 1.5 ft.), maroon red, calla-lily-shaped flower. [16]

Anthurium cf. podophyllum, "**SNOWFLAKE ANTHURIUM**" - Rare house/patio plant w/ long-stalked, snowflake-shaped leaves elaborately divided hand-wise into slender segments; interesting green flowers & yellow fruits; longtime Riverside patio resident. [19]

Begonia dregii, "**BONSAI BEGONIA**" - Shrubby begonia w/ thick, brown stems from a tuber-like base, small, maple-like, green leaves often w/ silver markings & clusters of white flowers w/ yellow centers in summer, good bonsai subject. [8]

Brunfelsia jamaicensis, "**LADY OF THE NIGHT**" - Rare, evergreen shrub w/ lance-shaped leaves & 2-in., creamy white, fragrant flowers in summer, the flowers long-tubular w/ flared, ruffled petals; summer patio or outdoors in mildest Inland gardens. [5] (S*)

Buddleia indica, "**INDOOR OAK**" - Handsome shrubby houseplant or summer patio plant w/ glossy, deep green leaves w/ wavy margins, rarely producing tiny, yellow flowers; pinch to maintain bushiness (= *Nicodemia diversifolia*). [10]

Clerodendron thompsoniae, "**BLEEDING HEART GLORYBOWER**" - Evergreen vine for patio in summer, indoors during cold weather; 5 in., dark green, shiny leaves & sprays of scarlet flowers contrasting w/ white calyces over long summer season. [10] (B*)

Codiaeum variegatum, "**CROTON**" - Tropical shrub for patio in summer, house in winter; leathery, shiny, dark green leaves are variously blotched & spotted yellow, orange or scarlet, likes warmth and humidity. [6]

Davallia mariesii var. *stenolepis*, "**SQUIRREL'S FOOT FERN**" - Easy & handsome true fern w/ very, finely divided fronds arising from furry, foot-like rhizomes; fine on patio in moss lined basket or in the garden in well-amended soil (aka. *Davallia trichomanoides*). [9]

Davallia mariesii var. *stenolepis*, "**SQUIRREL'S FOOT FERN**" - Easy & handsome true fern w/ very, finely divided fronds arising from furry, foot-like rhizomes; fine on patio in moss lined basket or in the garden in well-amended soil (aka. *Davallia trichomanoides*). [19]

Dermatobotrys saundersii, "**TREE JOCKEY**" - Rare, tender sub-shrub

from southern Africa w/ rounded leaves clustered at the branch tips & tubular, coral-colored flowers below the leaves in winter/summer. indoors or protected patio Inland. [8] (H*)

Dichorisandra thyrsiflora, "**BLUE GINGER**" - Tropical, ginger-like plant w/ cane-like stems bearing broad, tapered leaves & topped with dense, conical spikes of unusual, blue-purple flowers over long spring to fall season; frost tender. [15]

Dracaena sp. (*Drysdale*), "**CORN-PLANT**" - Unusual, shrubby *Dracaena* w/ slender, cane-like branches bearing rosettes of broad, leathery, lance-shaped leaves & clusters of small, white, deliciously fragrant flowers. [4]

Ecbolium viride, "**GREEN SHRIMP PLANT**" - Rare, tender perennial w/ long, pointed, dark green leaves & bracted spikes of spurred, orchid-like flowers in an unlikely shade of teal; unusual! [5]

Epiphyllum (colors as marked), "**ORCHID CACTUS**" - Easy succulent perennial for containers on patio or under trees; flattened, arching, succulent stems produce huge, many petaled, pink flowers in spring. [13] (H*)

Epiphyllum (Sussman, Mexico), "**ORCHID CACTUS**" - Succulent perennial climbing to 8+ ft. w/ support; long flattened, scallop-edged stems & 3-in.-long, many petaled, trumpet-shaped flowers in summer; flowers remain open during the day. [16]

Euphorbia geroldii, "**THORNLESS CROWN OF THORNS**" - Rare Madagascar native, a thornless, much branched shrub w/ dark green, shiny, succulent leaves & tiny yellow flowers that are surrounded by showy, paired, red bracts; blooms nearly all year. [9]

Ficus benjamina 'Variegata', "**VARIIEG. WEeping BANYON**" - Variegated form of this popular house/patio plant w/ graceful, drooping branches & shiny green, long-pointed leaves marbled w/ creamy white; good in containers. [9]

Ficus deltoidea, "**MISTLETOE FIG**" - Tropical shrub, grown as houseplant w/ distinctive, broadly spoon-shaped, bright green leaves & showy, pea-sized figs changing from yellow to orange to red. [4]

Gynura aurantiaca 'Sarmentosa', "**PURPLE VELVET PLANT**" - Easy vining plant for patio in summer or houseplant during cool weather; leaves covered in dark purple velvet, 1/2 in. flowers orange, ill smelling; give good light for rich foliage color. [10]

Hadrodemas warszewiczianum, "**HADRODEMAs**" - Uncommon tropical perennial forming rosettes of light green, tapered, succulent leaves & dense, long stemmed clusters of small purple flowers produced intermittantly through the year. [6]

Hibiscus 'Cooperi', "**COOPERI HIBISCUS**" - Unusual, very tender shrub w/ oval, toothed leaves strikingly blotched & spattered w/ shades of green, white & pink; red, funnel-shaped flowers are produced in late summer/fall. [5] (H*)

Ledebouria socialis, "**SQUILL**" - Pretty lily relative w/ clustered, purple, above-ground bulbs & handsome rosettes of succulent leaves, silvery green w/ dark green spots above, purple below, & spikes of small, light purple flowers. [12] (W*)

Ludisia (Haemaria) discolor, "**JEWEL ORCHID**" - Choice, true orchid w/ rosettes of tapered, velvety, near black leaves w/ glowing orange-red filagree veins; 1/2 in., sparkling white flowers in tall spikes; likes warmth & high humidity. [10]

Mitrostigma axillare, "**AFRICAN GARDENIA**" - Tender, S. African, slow growing shrub w/ dark green, tapered, quilted leaves & clusters of long lasting, waxy white, deliciously fragrant flowers opening from pink buds in summer. [4] (S*)

Peperomia obtusifolia, "**PEPEROMIA**" - Easy houseplant w/ thick stems & succulent, oval, shiny dark green leaves & slender spikes of tiny white flowers in late summer; dry between waterings. [3]

Plectranthus 'Mona Lavender', "**AUTUMN-LILAC**" - Spectacular, shrubby perennial w/ broad, purplish, toothed leaves & branching spikes

of small, orchidlike flowers, lavender w/ dark purple spots, in fall. [12] (B*)

Pseuderanthemum atro, "Tricolor", "MARBLE PLANT" - Tender shrub for patio in summer or houseplant during cold weather; long, shiny leaves handsomely marbled in purple, green & white; flowers inconspicuous. [3]

Pteris nipponica, "BRAKE FERN" - Easy true fern w/ short-creeping rhizome, long, wiry stems & leathery fronds with narrow divisions, colored green w/ creamy-white along the veins; moderate watering. [11]

Rhipsalis cruciforme, "RHIPSALIS" - Unusual orchid cactus relative forming a much branched, leafless plant w/ angled, red-tinged stems & satin-petaled, starry, pink flowers; good hanging pot or basket plant. [30]

Saintpaulia ionantha (assorted), "AFRICAN VIOLET" - Most popular flowering houseplant forming dense rosettes of velvety, succulent, rounded leaves & clusters of flowers produced nearly year around - assorted colors in double & single petaled forms. [20]

Sanchezia speciosa, "SANCHEZIA" - Handsome houseplant shrub w/ 6-in., pointed leaves that are shiny green w/ mid-rib & main veins outlined in yellow & white; needs high humidity. [3]

Streptocarpella 'Concord Blue', "STREPTOCARPELLA" - Pretty African violet relative good for hanging containers; small, fuzzy, succulent leaves & funnel-shaped, lavender-blue flowers over long season; summer patio/houseplant except in frost free zones. [6] (H*)

Tillandsia albertiana, "AIR PLANT" - Unusual "air plant" grows without soil; tiny plant w/ slender, arched, frosted leaves arranged in 2-ranks & small, cherry red, trumpet shaped flowers in fall/winter; best outdoors. [5] (H*)

Tillandsia bulbosa, "AIR PLANT" - Unusual "air plant" grows without soil; small plant w/ tentacle-like leaves from a frosted, bulbous base & tubular, violet flowers w/ brilliant red bracts in fall/winter; likes shade & moisture. [6] (H*)

Tillandsia bulbosa 'Mini Brazil', "AIR PLANT" - Miniature form of this unusual "air plant" grows without soil; small plant w/ tentacle-like leaves from a frosted, bulbous base & tubular, violet flowers w/ brilliant red bracts in fall/winter; best indoors. [3] (H*)

Tillandsia caerulea, "AIR PLANT" - Unusual "air plant" grows without soil; long, slender, gray-fuzzy leaves & tiny, deep blue-purple, sweetly scented, trumpet-shaped flowers in fall/winter; best outdoors. [11] (H*S*)

Tillandsia caliginosa (fragrant), "AIR PLANT" - Unusual "air plant" grows without soil; tufts of very slender, gray-green, fuzzy leaves eventually forming a ball & spikes of yellow, trumpet-shaped, deliciously scented flowers in fall/winter; best outdoors. [6] (H*)

Tillandsia circinnata prolifera, "AIR PLANT" - "Air plant" grows without soil; long, narrow, curved & twisted, silver-green leaves & long spikes of small, violet flowers & a "pup" forming a new plant near the tip; best outdoors. [3]

Tillandsia cocoensis, "AIR PLANT" - Unusual "air plant" grows without soil; elongated, branched rosettes of short, slender, silvery leaves & spikes of trumpet-shaped, white flowers from rose-colored bracts in fall/winter; best outdoors. [3] (H*)

Tillandsia juncea, "AIR PLANT" - Unusual "air plant" grows without soil; spiky, upright clumps of slender, grass-like, gray-green leaves blushed purple & red-bracted spikes of tubular, violet flowers in fall/winter; best outdoors. [5] (H*)

Tillandsia pseudobaileyi, "AIR PLANT" - Unusual "air plant" grows without soil; arching, olive green, waxy leaves from a slender, bulbous base & branched spikes of tubular violet blue flowers in red bracts in fall/winter; best outdoors. [5] (H*)

Tillandsia recurvata, "BALL MOSS" - Toughest of "air plants" - a tiny, branching plant eventually forming a compact ball of slender, arched, silvery-green leaves, often found growing on telephone wires & cacti; best outdoors. [9]

Tillandsia seideliana, "AIR PLANT" - Unusual "air plant" grows without soil; slender, arched, green leaves eventually forming a ball & spikes of trumpet-shaped, indigo flowers emerge from pink bracts in fall/winter; best outdoors. [6] (H*)

Tillandsia usneoides, "SPANISH MOSS" - Among most unusual of plants; true "air" plant for protected patio location; best hanging among other plants where humidity is highest; water daily in hottest weather, less in winter; tiny flowers in summer. [15]

WATER & WATERSIDE PLANTS

Acorus gramineus 'Licorice', "LICORICE SWEET FLAG" - Handsome grasslike plant forming tight clumps of slender, dark green leaves; crushed leaves are licorice-scented & are used in Thai cooking & teas; useful for water feature margins & containers. [3]

Acorus gramineus 'Masamune', "VARIEGATED SWEET FLAG" - Handsome grasslike plant forming tight clumps of slender, cream-margined leaves; especially useful for water feature margins & containers. [15]

Baumea rubiginosa 'Variegata', "BAUMEA" - Perennial rush from New Zealand forming tight, upright clumps of slender, iris-like leaves that are green w/ vertical, creamy yellow stripes; good near water features. [4]

Colocasia esculenta 'Fontanesii', "VIOLET STEMMED TARO" - Elegant, tropical perennial w/ large, arrow-shaped sea-green leaves w/ purple edges born on waxy, deep purple stalks; can be grown in water. [38]

Cyperus alternifolius 'Gracilis', "DWARF UMBRELLA PLANT" - Small form of this easy & unusual perennial; clumps of green, three-sided, slender stalks topped by umbrella-like cluster of narrow, green bracts; good near water features or containers. [7] (F*)

Iris pseudacoris, "YELLOW FLAG" - Vigorous, rhizomatous perennial w/ sword-shaped foliage to 5 ft. topped w/ showy, yellow flowers in spring; good vertical accent near water feature. [11] (H*)

Pontederia cordata, "PICKEREL WEED" - Aquatic plant w/ long-stalked, heart-shaped leaves held well above the water & long stems topped w/ a compact spike of bright blue flowers. [6] (H*C*)
